Profile: Two-year letter-winner...has a career record of 13-14 in singles and 9-9 in doubles...**2008 (Sophomore Year):** Posted a 7-8 record in singles and a 4-2 mark in doubles...enjoyed most of her success in singles when playing the number six spot in the lineup; went 6-1 at number six and a combined 1-7 when playing the fourth and fifth positions...won two of her final three singles matches of the season, including a 6-2, 6-4 victory over Julie Cotrone of Catholic University to help the Royals to a 6-3 win in the semifinals of the Landmark Conference tournament...had three different doubles partners throughout the season: was 2-1 with senior Gretchen Sullivan, 2-0 with freshman Chelsea Paskman, and 0-1 with sophomore Deirdre Wylie...went 2-1 in both singles and doubles during the fall portion of the season...both of her singles victories came at the number six spot in the lineup, defeating Courtney Wilson of King's, 6-1, 2-6, 6-3, and Kirstie McKeever of Lycoming, 6-0, 6-0, before dropping a 6-4, 6-2 decision at the number four singles to Annie Gotchel of Messiah...both of her doubles victories came with senior Gretchen Sullivan as her partner: they defeated Kelly Drinkard and Erika Niemann of Lycoming, 8-1, and Stacey Clark and Sadra Sumner of Messiah, 8-6...**2006 (Freshman Year):** Finished with six victories in singles, which tied seniors Gretchen Sullivan and Danielle Red for the team-lead...also posted a 5-7 mark with partners Nicole Cruciani and Mary Heather Earley in doubles...played her first five singles matches at the number six spot and the remainder at number five...won six of her first nine singles matches and five of her first six doubles matches...ended her season with a hard-fought 6-3, 3-6, 0-1 (5-10) loss to Emma Dunn of Susquehanna in the first round of the Flight 5 singles at the Middle Atlantic Conference individual championships at Lehigh University in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania, on October 21.

Profile: Joined the women's tennis program in the spring after being a key member of the Royals' Landmark Conference women's soccer championship team last fall...was named the Landmark Conference Rookie of the Year and a first-team all-conference selection in women's soccer...scored five goals and had three assists as Scranton finished the 2007 season with a 9-9-2 overall record in women's soccer...**2008 (Freshman Year):** Finished her first season with the program with a 5-2 record in singles and a 2-1 mark in doubles...all seven singles matches were played at the number six spot in the lineup and her three doubles matches came at the number three position...posted a 2-1 record in singles and a 1-0 mark in doubles against Landmark Conference opponents...was 2-0 in matches decided in three sets...both of her wins in doubles came when paired with sophomore Caroline Curtin.
